

This is official notification that Alternative Certification for Teachers-Rio Grande Valley has received the status of "ACCREDITED" under the Accountability System for Educator Preparation (ASEP). The status is issued for the period from September 1, 2010, through August 31, 2011, by the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) under the authority of Texas Education Code Section 21.045.

Accreditation statuses are issued annually to each educator preparation program and are based on performance standards established by Texas Education Code (TEC) and outlined in Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 229. For the period mentioned above, the status represents performance by the program candidates on examinations required for certification as an educator (Standard I).
