INITIAL PROGRAM SCREENING

- Evaluation of work experience for suggested certification areas.
- Evaluation of education (Bachelor's degree, Associate's degree, high school degree, GED, transcript).
- Meet with ACTRGV representative for Interview and transcript review.
- Submit application, resume, Statement of Qualifications (SOQ required for TIE), work-related licensure
 or certification, and verification of education to ACTRGV.
- Take and pass a Critical Thinking Exam with a minimum score of 45.
- TOEFL-IBT (Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet Based Test code B241) minimum speaking score of 24, listening score of 22, reading score of 22, and writing score of 21. Approved score as of October 22, 2017
- Candidates seeking certification for Trade and Industry will require test approval from ACTRGV.
- All candidates must submit the signed receipt for the Candidate Policy Handbook and FERPA Agreement.

ONCE YOU HAVE BEEN ADMITTED INTO THE PROGRAM, BEGIN THE FOLLOWING:

FIELD-EXPERIENCE HOURS – Must be completed prior to teaching

- Complete 30 clock-hours of field-experience (observations in an accredited K-12 Texas school).
- Of the 30 hours, 15 must be interactive with students under a certified teacher's supervision.
- Observations will be recorded on the ACTRGV observation form and submitted to the ACTRGV office.
 This form is available on the ACTRGV website.
- Initial contact with the district must be made through the human resources office. School districts will require a TB test and a background check prior to entry into a classroom.

COMPLETE THE SPRING, SUMMER, OR FALL TRAINING - 150 hours must be completed prior to teaching

- To reserve a spot in a training session, a down payment must be received at least one week prior to the start of the session.
- Training schedule will be provided
- All sessions must be completed.

PREPARE TO TAKE THE PPR #370

- Make an appointment and take the representative form of the PPR practice test 370.
- Attend a scheduled six-hour review for the PPR #370.

BEGIN CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION (CPE) HOURS

• The Texas Education Agency requires candidates to complete 300 hours of continuing professional education (CPE) during their internship. Information about opportunities to meet this requirement will be posted on the website (www.actrgv.com).

BEGIN A ONE-YEAR INTERNSHIP AS A CERTIFIED TEACHER-OF-RECORD

Note: To be recommended for a state-issued Probationary/Intern Certificate, candidates

- Must submit an official transcript, in a sealed envelope, with a "degree conferred" notation (if degree is required),
- Must submit proof of 30 Field-Experience Hours,
- Must have completed all Institute (Training) hours,
- Must have passed the TEXES PPR 370,
- Must submit work related licensure/certificate and
- Must have verification of appropriate employment by the hiring district (Statement of Eligibility Form).

NOTE: A one-year Intern/Probationary Certificate is available only if the content/content-related exam(s) is/are passed
